What is the... **STUDENT ALUMNI COUNCIL**

The Student Alumni Council (SAC) is a volunteer group of student leaders from across campus. SAC seeks to create a strong pipeline of future engaged alumni through meaningful student activities.

SAC host a few signature events throughout the year, including Freshman Welcome, Founders Day, and the UGA Ring Ceremony. In addition, SAC members serve at various events hosted by UGA's Development and Alumni Relations including Beat Week, Dawg Day of Gratitude, and Dawg Day of Giving. SAC members also have the opportunity to connect with alumni at events like 40 Under 40, Bulldog 100, and Alumni Awards.

How do I... **BECOME A MEMBER**

Applications for SAC are open from September 15 through October 15. The application process includes:

- A digital application with several essay questions for you to share your experiences with UGA traditions and alumni, and your experience giving back to communities that matter to you.
- Sign-up for a group interview. Interview sign-ups are offered to students that complete the digital application. Group interviews are conducted in groups of four.
- Individual interviews will be offered to candidates based on application materials. Invitations to hold an individual interview will be sent out in early November.

How do members... **MAKE AN IMPACT**

SAC members are servant leaders in the organization and beyond. Members are expected to:

- Make a gift of \$10 each academic year. This gift can be to any area of campus. Members choose to give to a variety of funds, like their school or college, a student-impact fund, or a cause.
- Be in good academic standing. Members need to maintain a GPA of 2.75 or higher.
- Serve a minimum of 50 service hours per semester. Service hours are earned by supporting various SAC and Development and Alumni Relations programs and events, as well as attending mandatory SAC trainings and meetings.



MEETINGS

SAC members meet weekly on Tuesdays from 5 – 6:30 PM at a central campus location. These meetings are a mix of project work and member training and development.

COMMITTEES

Each member is placed into a committee after their spring semester orientation. Committees work in a variety of roles that involve project management, event planning, and networking.
