

UGA Alumni Association - Volunteer of the Year Rubric Guide

Attitude-10 points

Volunteer of the year should demonstrate a positive and proactive attitude. An individual who scores highly in this category is an active member of the chapter leadership who displays an attitude that is a positive representation of the chapter and the University of Georgia. Please use the information provided to assess if the individual consistently exhibits an attitude that is enthusiastic, inclusive, cooperative and generally positive.

Dependability – 10 points

Volunteer of the year demonstrates exceptional dependability as a chapter leader by consistently attending events and meetings, meeting expectations set by the chapter board, following through on tasks they are responsible for completing, being highly organized and using all available resources to contribute as an autonomous leader. An individual who scores highly in this category should be consistently motivated and reliable.

Dedication – 10 points

Volunteer of the year should demonstrate dedication to the chapter and to the University of Georgia. An individual who scores highly in this category has consistently dedicated a substantial amount of time and energy to make their chapter, and in turn, the University of Georgia better in some way. The volunteer has also supported UGA philanthropically and is in good standing as a board member.

Creativity – 10 points

Volunteer of the year brings creative and innovative event ideas and chapter initiatives to the chapter board. An individual who scores highly in this category brings new, unique, and original ideas to the chapter. This individual demonstrates creative critical thinking and implements or executes new events and initiatives in a clever and innovative way.

Overall Effectiveness – 10 points

Volunteer of the year should have contributed to the chapter in a way that elevated the effectiveness or scope of engagement for the chapter. An individual who scores highly in this category is an ideal, effective representative of the chapter and the University of Georgia in their role as a chapter leader. Please use all materials provided to determine if the individual has made notable contributions that have led to the improvement of the chapter, chapter programming, and/or chapter board.
